As the children in our community return to school, we will also begin a new season of Children's Sunday School here at Laurel Heights on Sunday, August 22nd.

- Preschoolers, age 3 and 4 will meet in Mann Chapel. This is the small glass-walled chapel
 inside the sanctuary. This is a Godly Play class where children will learn how to be a part of a
 Godly Play circle and listen and wonder about the stories of God.
- Children in Kindergarten through 2nd grade will meet in Room 105. This is a Godly Play class where the children will discover and wonder about the stories of God and the people of God.
- **Grade 3 through Grade 5** will meet in Room 313 A on the third floor. This class is all about becoming familiar with the bible and the stories it holds. Students in this class will each receive a student bible.
- The **Junior High** students will meet in Room 320. This class focuses on Methodism and topics central to the life of the church.
- The Senior High students will meet in Room 321. This class is a lectionary-based class that digs
 into the scripture reading for each Sunday.

I hope you and your family will join us as we return to a more traditional Sunday School format. We look forward to gathering again in our Sunday School circles to hear the stories of God!



I became acquainted with Laurel Heights through my wife Katie, a life-long member. This place immediately reminded me of the church I grew up attending in Moorhead, MN. I was raised in neighboring Fargo, ND, and attending services or participating in youth activities at Trinity Lutheran was a constant in my life until I left for college.

Both Trinity and Laurel Heights value a high standard of traditional worship music and developing an appreciation for singing amongst the youth. I began singing in the preschool choir at Trinity, and that started a nearly unbroken streak in my life of being a part of a choir in some way.

I love many different types of instruments, some of which I play. For me, though, the human voice is the apex of musical expression. I believe that if you can speak, you can sing. Don't come at me saying "I can't carry a tune." I'm not saying every one of us can sing like Ella Fitzgerald if we put our mind to it, but I really do think each of us is capable of making music with our voice.

I absolutely love that we have this instrument with us at all times – no carrying case required. And since we're born with this instrument inside us, we can begin using it right away. My son Lyle, who turns two in August, recently began singing. He likes to plunk notes on the piano, and a couple of weeks ago he started adding in some "la la las". Even if he doesn't pursue singing to the same level his parents did, it's brought me so much joy to see this tradition of the human voice continuing on in a new generation.

off Woodlawn




