"Simply Generous"

"I am no longer my own, but thine." Attributed to John Wesley in his Covenant Prayer, the words are at once poetic and archaic. But they pack a punch in any day. We, as humans and certainly as Americans, get bound up in our wants. Often seeing them as needs or 'must haves', we can constantly feel tied to our cars, our phones, our electronics, our sports teams, our politics, our recipes, our media of choice. The concept of simplicity seems more and more out of reach in our increasingly complicated world. The stewardship season theme at Laurel Heights UMC of *Simply Generous* also packs a punch when examined. At first glance "Simply"



can be understood as *merely* or *only*, when a closer look opens the ways that these two words are intertwined.

My granddaughters are fascinated by a rotary dial candlestick phone from my youth. In today's world of iPhones and Androids they don't even understand fully that the device was used for communication. Even its plug is obsolete. It has gone the way of so many constant upgrades in our lives. Children's fascinations seem simple indeed. For me, it is more likely wanting something newer, faster, bigger, snazzier.

Last week Clyta Coder beautifully wrote of being taught to give of *first fruits*. But often my needs to accommodate my own comfort and that of my family cloud my understanding of first fruits. When we give of what's left or our residue, I think we are saying to God, "I am mine." In other words, we prioritize our own fullness above the opportunity to know God fully. Making my gift to Laurel Heights as the very first item I pay each month is a way to say "I am thine" or, in today's words, "I am God's". The simple prayer that Pastor Lisa distributed on cards on October 9th in worship troubles me in the best of ways. In it we ask God to take away desires we shouldn't have and to replace them with God. I am all for devotion to God. But please don't mess with my chocolate, my french fries, or my love of live theatre. Ouch! But, yes, those can be idolatries too.

As we move toward Commitment Sunday on October 30, let me take a close look at places in my life where I say "I am MINE." Perhaps, even if a bit archaic, I can instead try "I am thine". Join Me?






