Stewardship by Nick Campbell

When I was asked to give the stewardship talk, I began to think about what to say...let me clarify that a bit...I began to obsess about what to say, the reasons that Genny and I have for giving...I mean people are depending on me to come up with something profound! Something deep yet engaging! This is a lot of responsibility! ... (I tend to be a little obsessive compulsive!) ... But more about that later...

I thought first about duty and the practical aspect of giving...There are bills to pay, and if Genny and I truly believe in the mission of this institution and want to see these traditions of love, charity, fellowship and support for our community continue, then it makes sense to put our money where our mouth is and support the church financially. The quote that I think may fit with this thought is from Martin Luther:

"God does not need our good works, but our neighbor does"

Next, I thought about Gratitude / Appreciation... This church helped raise me, gave me confidence, showed me love. I met my love here, we raised our children, buried our fathers, my mother and brother here. Good grief! To sit here some Sundays with four generations of my family sitting in these pews is an incredible blessing! Genny and I learned to share this love and support with others, maybe even helping to lift others out of a dark place on occasion, the way I was lifted and supported... Young married with an overwhelming sense of responsibility, two young boys, bills to pay, the real estate market crashing in the late 1980's, I felt the weight of the world on my shoulders... and I remember Dinah Tanner, a wise, wise cracking school counselor who had been a member here my entire life told Genny and me "you do the best you can, and then you move on" ...an early message of letting go and letting God.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer had this to say about gratitude:

"In ordinary life, we hardly realize that we receive a great deal more than we give and it is only with gratitude that life becomes rich"

At this point in my journey, it is becoming clearer to me that God has placed within me and Genny, and I believe all of us, a need. It is a need to give in order to complete the continuum of love we have within us. It seems so simple, giving is like sharing love, "the more you give, the more you get". I must confess that I still allow fear to control my thoughts at times ... but Genny and I have never been disappointed or gone hungry when sharing our gifts with the church, in fact, the opposite has proven true in our lives. So, I try, little by little to trust and allow myself to love and be loved, to give and receive. The quote I think helps capture this thought is from Billy Graham:

"We are not cistern made for storing, we are channels made for sharing"

As this began, I mentioned I was a little OCD, that I fight my need for control and security over trusting God. So, I was sitting on the back porch asking God for help with this talk. Of course, my prayer was "God give me a good joke or story to capture people's attention" He sent me a gentle breeze and a hummingbird...on its way to Central America, and a message saying trust and let it be.




