#### In God's Steps: A Miraculous Journey

I was thirty years old, a new father and homeowner. I had started to find myself in leadership around the then San Antonio District and Southwest Texas Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. I found a spiritual home in ecumenical networks and learning of global movements seeking the unity of the Body of Christ. John 17:20-21 seemed to be a mantra for my own theology. I learned the language of ecumenism, which is a whole vocabulary unto itself! I had never considered myself a racist.

I was thirty-four years old and found myself elected to serve as the only white lay man on the global General Commission on Christian Unity & Interreligious Concerns. The fact that I can say that name quickly and type it quickly without error says it all in some ways. I started to be challenged to build interfaith relationships. First with Jewish friends at Temple Beth El and elsewhere, then Muslim friends in other states. I was getting ahead of my faith. I sought help and learned much from the then United Methodist Women and other groups about a Christian's challenge to value other understandings of creation and relationships with God. I began to know and learn from a new mentor, Bishop William Boyd Grove then serving the Albany New York area. A white man of great accomplishment



and distinction, Bishop Grove had the respect of all other bishops, others Christians and persons of all living faith communities. I had never considered myself a racist.

I was forty-one years old and was named to serve as a member and then as treasurer of the Pan-Methodist Commission. It is the global intersection of the African Methodist Episcopal, African Methodist Episcopal Zion, Christian Methodist Episcopal and United Methodist Churches—denominations divided by, in some cases torn apart by, one thing: race. Again I found myself across tables from Bishop Grove. I began to realize that we were often

the only white faces in these meetings of 30-40 bishops, clergy and laypersons. As I observed his wisdom and heart, I began to understand the challenge that a white person and especially a white man must take on to wrestle with and conquer his privilege and power. You see, without uttering a word or making a move, white persons operate in a sphere of privilege that must be acknowledged and considered. I shed tears in realizing that unity of those four denominations did not mean structural merger, that the value is in learning the struggles of one another largely benefitting the white majority and marginalizing Black members outside and inside the United Methodist Church. I very much wanted merger. Bishop Grove helped me to realize that merger was a human construct rather than a divine one. He helped me to understand the freedom of acknowledging privilege and wrestling with what it means to be a *recovering racist*. The moment I understood that is one of the more freeing moments of my adult life.

In God's Steps cont.

I realized that fact many years ago now and it has led me to and through repentance, reconciliation, and even trust among persons of other races and ethnicities as I never understood or expected. God can do great things with us once we find ourselves open to being used. Come with us on this miraculous journey. My hope is that this insight gives you an idea of why the study *In God's Steps* is so important to me. I share these steps in my life above to attempt a transparency that is painful and freeing. I challenge you to think of your own journey and see what you recall and what may be left undone.

Registration is open for In God's Steps: Walking Together Toward Racial Justice.


